Directions to Trailhead

Donegal Town is situated on the N15 primary road, half way between Sligo and Letterkenny. The Diamond is the centre of town, just north of the harbour car park and Tourist Information Office.

The Bluestack Way is fully marked using Yellow Arrows and Walking Man

Walk Directions

A-B. From the trailhead, follow the yellow arrow and walking man along the footpath on the left side out the Ballybofey road passing the famine graveyard and Community Hospital. After the Flooring Company shop, the trail turns left towards the River Eske and crosses under the Donegal Town bypass. Now you walk along quiet country lanes, joining the International Appalachian Trail at a T-junction, turn left, cross the River Eske. At the next crossroads, turn right and immediately left to join the path marked in yellow on the map through the woods and a short board walk along the shore of Lough Eske. As you leave the shore, take a right, and right again, following the track to a T-junction where you turn right onto the road towards the eastern shore of Lough Eske and on past Harvey's Point Hotel on your right.


B-C. After leaving the lake shore, the road climbs to a T-junction. Turn right here and follow the road until you pass Eas Dun Lodge B&B. Take the first turn left. Now the road changes to a gravel track and rises steadily, giving fantastic views along the south-eastern Bluestack Mountains and back over Lough Eske and south east Donegal. The trail enters the Eglish Valley and becomes a paved road once more. At the end of the valley turn right to cross the Eglish River and stay right to pass the ruin of the Meenataggard Dance Hall. Pass through the gate, climb over the stile and follow the fence line through the field, and over another stile. Now the route turns south and passes by an old house, crosses the Struell River and once more joins a paved road. Here you have the option to turn left, leave the trail for the day and follow the red arrow and walking man south to get to the Bluestack Centre and Hostel (074) 9735564 (ca6km), or turn right and stay on the trail.

C-D. After ca. 350m turn left and follow the route on a farm track through a series of gates and over open moorland where you can see turf being 'won'. Enjoy the views from this plateau. As you descend the track turns into a paved road and ends at a T-junction. Here you have another option to leave the trail for the Bluestack Centre (see above). If you turn right you arrive at Tymeen Football Pitch after ca.1km; a perfectly groomed pitch at the foot of the Bluestack Mountains with a picnic bench, toilet and shower facilities.

This is the end of section 1 of the Bluestack Way.
