Breakdown of Dormant Accounts Funding

Community Sports and Physical Activity Hubs (CSPAH)

Dormant Accounts Funding will be allocated to establish and develop 5 Local Sports Partnerships (LSP) led CSPAHs in 2023, with additional funding allocated to 39 existing hubs.

The objective of the Community Sport and Physical Activity Hubs is to bring local people together and provide a home for local clubs and sports organisations. The Community Sport and Physical Activity Hubs will focus on three themes:

- 1. Community Sports Hub
- 2. School Community Sports Hub
- 3. Outdoor Community Sports Hub

The hubs sit within the existing structures of the LSPs which operate under the remit of Sport Ireland. The hubs will provide information, support and advice on a wide range of sports and physical activities to make it easier for people in disadvantaged areas to get involved and engage in a more active and healthier lifestyle.

Youth Leadership

This initiative involves the development and delivery of a variety of leadership training programmes for young people providing a stepping stone for learners into employment and also into further education or training. These programmes will develop generic leadership skills that can be applied to a variety of sports and/or recreational situations as well as contributing to the personal development of the learner.

Overall the initiative will provide training for young people, keeping them engaged, increasing their responsibility, and developing their confidence and self-esteem and will provide an opportunity for lifelong volunteering. The programme has the potential to impact on both early school dropout in disadvantaged areas and dropout rates from sport within the targeted age group.

Volunteer Supports

The volunteer supports initiative aims to successfully identify and assist targeted individuals who are volunteering in disadvantaged communities or with people with disabilities to gain community sport and physical activity leadership skills e.g., as coaches, leaders, referees, committee members etc. This fund is used to support coaching and development programmes or standalone training opportunities to support targeted volunteers.

Initiatives will be carried out in disadvantaged communities and/or with people with disabilities with the aim to contribute to the development of confidence amongst participants, and eventually in the community through the subsequent volunteer sport development work carried out by participants.

Disability Training Framework

The 2023 Dormant Accounts Fund will enable Active Disability Ireland to continue working closely with the National Governing Bodies (NGBs) and LSPs. Following on from the success of their Xcessible Club toolkit launched in 2022 they will conduct an analysis of the impact of the Xcessible Club Toolkit in supporting clubs to adopt the principles of the Sports Inclusion Disability Charter.

Active Disability Ireland will continue to progress the great outdoors project which aims to build capacity amongst those working in the outdoor environment to make it more inclusive, as well as enhancing the quality of sport and physical activity opportunities in the outdoors for people with a disability.

Sports Inclusion Disability Projects (SIDP)

The SIDP fund aims to reduce barriers to sports participation for people with a disability through minor infrastructure development and the provision of equipment. The fund can be used to purchase a range of disability sports equipment such as beach wheelchairs and pool pods and enabling infrastructure including handrails and fittings. This infrastructure will seek to increase participation in sport or physical activity for people with a disability in their county.

Innovation for Sports Inclusion

Within the <u>National Sports Policy 2018-2027</u>, one of the overarching values is innovation. The National Sports Policy "will encourage and stimulate innovative solutions to the challenges we seek to address around participation, high performance and the development of the sports sector." Additionally, the National Sports Policy promotes "developing an adaptable and innovative sports sector that is capable of identifying and responding to the differing and changing needs of individuals at different points in their lives."

The objectives of the Innovation Fund are to:

- Pilot new approaches to the development and promotion of sport participation
- Evaluate and document successes and failures of the approach; and
- Demonstrate replicability and scalability for nationwide use and implementation.

These projects look to test innovative and scalable solutions to critical problems and challenges in the development of sports participation at national, local, community and individual levels.

Urban Outdoor Adventure Initiatives (UOAI)

The objective of the UOAI is to create opportunities for people living in disadvantaged communities to participate in outdoor adventure sports in urban settings. The programme also seeks to create new opportunities for people with a disability and at-risk youths. Opportunities for people living in urban communities to experience outdoor adventure sports are limited due to natural environments, distance from traditional outdoor settings (forests, mountains etc.) where activities are usually offered, and need for equipment, supervision, training and support to engage in these sports.

Her Moves

The Her Moves campaign, which builds upon the Girls Get Active programme, was launched in March 2023. The vision of the campaign is to implement a systems change campaign through the creation of a brand, effective messaging, an online space and physical activity opportunities. This will give girls confidence and motivation, make them feel empowered to be active in their own way. To support this campaign, LSPs will create and deliver sports and physical activity programmes based on the 8 Key Principles of Success from the <u>Adolescent Girls Get Active Research Report</u>. The fund is focused on supporting the development and piloting of programmes and initiatives that target reducing the drop out in sport and physical activity in adolescent girls.
