## Strickeen 'The Little Peak'

Strickeen (Struicín) mountain is one of the more accessible mountains of the MacGillycuddy Reeks. The path to Strickeen ascends the western slopes of Gap of Dunloe a glacially carved V-shaped valley. Strickeen is the anglicised version of 'Struicín' which means 'little peak' or 'crested ridge' in Gaelic. In spite of its name the views from the top are no less breathtaking than any of its larger more prominent neighbours in the MacGillycuddy Reeks. At the peak you will be afforded spectacular views of the MacGillycuddy Reeks to the West, the Lakes of Killarney to the East and the Atlantic Ocean to the North West.

As this is a Mountain environment be aware that conditions are variable. Appropriate clothing and footwear are recommended for this trail. For more information and guidelines on walking in the MacGillycuddy Reeks please scan this QR code.

\*These trails may have some climbs and may have an uneven surface where the going is rough underfoot with some obstacles such as protruding roots, rocks etc. The routes are appropriate for people with a moderate level of fitness and some walking experience. Specific outdoor walking footwear and clothing is recommended.

Access to Strickeen is available by kind permission of all the landowners/holders on the route. It is understood that persons entering do so by permission with the consent of the landowner and no matter how often they enter, or in what numbers, they do not do so as of right. No amount of expenditure by the partners to this agreement or by private individuals on the route being used will alter this position. As further evidence of the permissive nature of the access, the route will be closed on the 31st of January each year in agreement with the landowners. Nothing in this notice shall impact or address any pre-existing public rights of way.



The route is waymarked for ease of navigation.
